Mystery Handshake April 11

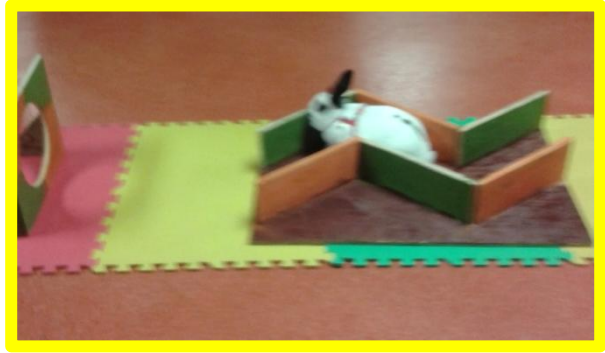
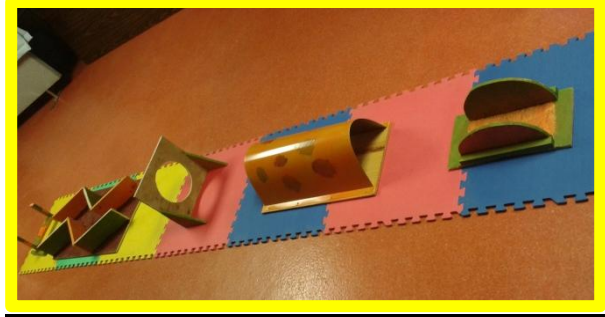
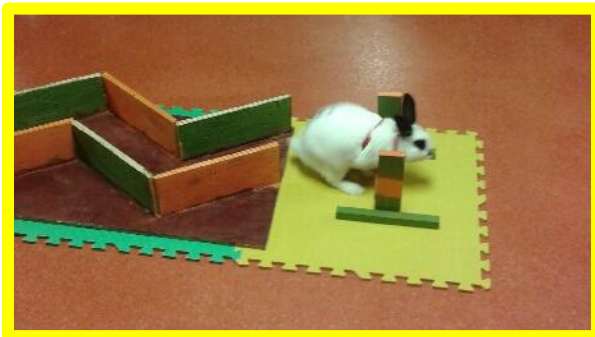
Keith Hamilton was the Mystery Handshake for the evening and Brian Dunlop did not shake his hand.
