1959

Kiwanis International moves its office to 101 East Erie Street in Chicago.

1961

Kiwanis International is 5,000 clubs strong. Kiwanis International convention delegates vote to open clubs outside the United States and Canada at the International Convention in Toronto, ON.

1962 - MAY 15

The Kiwanis Club of Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, becomes the first club organized outside the United States and Canada.
