He started his career in Walaceburg 1977, and left Policing in 1987 for a private buiness opportunity, he then rejoined Tilbury Police Service in 1991. He was placed in the Detective office at Amalgamation Time of 1998 and remained there for 12 years. He went back onto street performing regular Police duties for 9 months and then was posted into Crime Stoppers in the fall of 2009 and remains there at this time.

- > No Call Display, No recordings
- 24hr/day, 24hr answering service
- Information gathering only does not conduct the investigation
