Guest Speaker

Chatham-Kent Police Special Constable Brenda Koldyk spoke to us about Internet Safety. Brenda is a 15 year veteran of the police force. She works specifically with Internet and social media problems. This is something we all need to be aware of, not just for our kids, but for us also. The Internet is a wonderful tool for communication, knowledge, music, online shoppping and research. However, we need to be aware of the dangers predators and hackers are always looking for ways to cash in on vulnerable people. You need proper security features at all times. Predators are not who they pretend to be. A predator is anyone you don't know in real life. You teach children not to talk to strangers, and the internet is no different. If it is not a personal friend, don't communicate with them...internet strangers are invisible.

Delete does not erase your information or pictures. They are always there for everyone to see. Prospective employers, predators and hackers are always able to access your personal information.

Your Facebook page should be available for friends only. Change the privacy

settings by using the wheel at the top right of the page.

Your Webcam can be activated remotely so always close it when not in use and always be fully dressed when in front of it. Geotagging adds the geographical location to your phone. Disable geotagging on your phone.

If you send or receive these, you are guilty of distribution and possession of pornography.

Everything is archived on the internet and it is there forever.

Police in this area estimate 50% of their calls involve social media problems and crimes.

Would you sit down next to a stranger and give them your personal information and give them pictures of yourself? No, then why would you do it online? Check your children's cell phone messages and social media sites and pictures. You buy the cell phones and computers and pay the monthly bill. Be a parent, don't expect the police to do it for you.
