Guest Speaker Dr. David and Margaret Campbell

They presented a slide show about their work at the Chausy Orphanage in Belarus. A combination of factors have made life in Belarus extremely difficult. During World

War II much of the infrastructure was destroyed and 2/3 of the men lost their lives. When the disaster at Chernobyl happened much of the radiation travelled north into Belarus. Since the collapse of the USSR in 1996, the Belarus ruble has continually dropped in value. Parents who cannot afford to feed their children will drop them at a hospital and eventually the children will find their way to an orphanage. One such orphanage is the Chausy Orphanage where Margaret and David work.

Over the years, in conjunction with Canadian Aid for Chernobyl (based in Brockville, Ontario), the Campbells have done a tremendous amount of work to help these children. They collect supplies and ship them to Belarus. In 2006 they started an agricultural program. So far, they have provided a tractor to plant crops, built three greenhouses (in which they grow cucumbers, tomatoes and peppers), a chicken barn (for both laying and meat birds) and recently added a pig barn. The farm provides food to feed the community and they are able to sell some of the produce at market.

The Campbells recognized that the children require eye care. They arranged for eye tests to be done and approximately fifty children received glasses.

They have also helped a local daycare. Most children will spend twelve hours a day in care while their mother works. They provided tables, chairs, beds, a refrigerator and a washer for the centre. They also distributed blankets and quilts made here in Ridgetown by volunteers at Mount Zion Presbyterian Church. The Campbells have also donated many games and toys from their own home.

It was a privilege to have the Campbells share their amazing work with us.
