The George F. Hixson Fellowship

George Hixon was an early Kiwanis International President who dedicated 50 years of his life to Kiwanis Service. The website claims he was the first International president but some of us believe that is not true. We believe Donald Johnston from Rutherford was the first president, but that is a story for another time.

Donors who give \$1,000US become George F Hixon Fellows and receive a

commemorative tie tack or lapel pin along with two numbered medallions hanging from blue and white ribbons. One medallion is encased in a walnut box for display purposes, the other is to be worn.

Donors making an additional donation of \$1,000US will receive a diamond pin for the ribbon and special tab for the tie tack or lapel pin.

All funds received towards Hixon Fellowships are unrestricted and can be used by the Kiwanis International Foundation where it is determined the need is greatest, unless specified by the donor. Our Club has just a few George F Hixon Fellows at this time.

The Mel Osborne Fellowship

The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada Inc., resulted from a challenge made to Kiwanis Canada by Past International Vice President Mel Osborne of the East York (Toronto) Kiwanis Club. Mel was sure that a National foundation would unite, strengthen Kiwanis and increase membership in all of Canada. Mel had served with distinction as a Governor of the Ontario-Quebec-Maritime District in 1953, International Trustee from 1960-64 and as International Vice-President during 1965-65. Early in 1965 he retired from the International board due to health reasons. In 1966 he was appointed to the Board of Trustees of the Kiwanis International Foundation where he served until 1970. Mel's experience on the International Foundation Board persuaded him to recommend that Kiwanis Clubs in Canada should form a Canadian Foundation to promote the work of Kiwanis on a national scale in Canada. Kiwanians supported the plan and it was approved. The Government of Canada granted the Charter for the Kiwanis Foundation of Canada Incorporated on July 27, 1973. The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada has, therefore, brought into existence an award, which honours one of the founders. This fellowship consists of Kiwanians and others who have contributed to the growth and work of Kiwanis. Their service and dedication is remembered and honoured by their being named to this prestigious society. The Foundation sends a special scroll honouring their contribution and the uniquely designed medallion.

President Brad and PP Dale presented Distinguished President June with a Mel Osborne Fellowship. June joined the club in February 2004. She quickly became involved with the Key Club and has served as our club advisor to the RDHS Key Club since 2004, one month after she joined the club. June's commitment to the members of Key Club has been outstanding.

She (and Gary) have spent countless hours driving, helping, supporting and mentoring these young people. She bakes for them, she attends their weekly meetings, their fundraising and service projects, their training and divisional meetings, their district conventions and their graduations. To many Key Clubbers, June has been a second mother.

June served as President of our club from 1 October 2007 to 31 October 2008, then continued on until 30 April 2009 to help fill a gap in the president's position. When the club was presented with a new fundraiser, the craft show, June stepped up to co-chair the project and continues to do so, spending many, many hours working with vendors to ensure the best possible show and fundraiser for our club.
