Remembrance Day Presentation

Leonard Hearns grew up in Ridgetown. At the age of 16 he wanted to join the armed forces and joined the Navy. He started his training in Cornwallis, completed his communications training in British Columbia then was sent back to the East Coast where he lived in a dorm with 23 other men.

In September 1969 he left on his first tour of duty in Europe.

He had the opportunity to sail on the HMCS Bonaventure before it was retired. After the Bonaventure he was assigned to a French speaking ship. He had some time in Newfoundland but always wanted to be back at sea. He had to learn how to sleep on a ship that was moving up and down. Many times they would stop in the middle of the ocean to go swimming. For three years he sailed out of Victoria, BC. During that tour he visited many of the countries of the south Pacific such as Hawaii and Fiji.

He became a teacher for the Navy and alternated between time teaching and time at sea. When he became a Chief Petty Officer he was moved back to Halifax. He was assigned Chief Petty Officer of a ship and sailed it for two years, retiring from the Navy when they retired his ship. Four months after his retirement he returned to the Navy to start a recruitment office in Borden and ran that office for the next six years.

Throughout his career he spent 22 years at sea.

In 2009 he was assigned Formation Chief for the Naval Reserve, the highest NCO position. When asked if he would do it again, his answer was "yes, in a heartbeat. I made friends for life. At this time of year it is important to remember your friends."

The Remembrance Day service in Ridgetown was well attended this year. Kiwanis was represented by ten members. Each year our club as well as Key Club and Aktion Club lay a wreath at the cenotaph. President Dennis represented our club, Key Club President Brandon and Aktion Club member Edith represented their clubs.

At the service Captain Ryan Moore, RCAF gave an excellent presentation on life in the current armed forces. He talked about how having a family member in the forces affects a family and their feelings. He ended with "Do not be afraid."

1916 - MAY 18-19

The first convention is held in Cleveland, Ohio. Business includes approving the organization's constitution and electing George Hixson as the president of the "National Kiwanis Club".

1916 - NOVEMBER 1

The Kiwanis Club of Hamilton, Ontario, is chartered, making Kiwanis an international organization.

1917

The first issue of an official Kiwanis publication is titled Kiwanis Club.
