Remembrance Day Speaker Sheridan Atkinson

Sheridan and Susan Atkinson have been married for 43 years, he is 92 years young, and of course it is not nice to ask Susan so we will assume she is no more than 30. He lived in Ridgetown in the late 1930's with his first wife Louise Bassett (Claire Bassett's sister). He then went to WWII, came back and then they moved to London. They had 7 children together, Louise passed away then he met and married Susan. Nine years later they had child number eight. His entire career was spent working for the Department of Veteran Affairs. He retired as District Director of Southwestern Ontario. He was a member of the Royal Canadian Regiment of London.

On July 10, 1944 he was involved in Operation Husky. This was the invasion of Sicily by 100,000 troops from Canada, Great Britain and the USA. 3,000 ships from all over the world were involved in Operation Husky. 25,000 Canadian troops stormed the beaches and fought their way into the hills of Sicily, liberating the island and its' people from the Germans. The operation was 28 days long and took them through many hill towns such as Pochino, and Modina.

There are Canadian markers throughout this region to commemorate the places where Canadian soldiers fell. There is one Cemetery on the island where 20,000 soldiers lay buried. The markers are slim white posts with red Maple Leafs with the Italian flag on them.

The island is very dusty and dry. Most of the time the Canadians were there, it was in plus 100 degrees Fahrenheit heat. Sheridan and Susan took thousands of small Canadian flags for the school children of Sicily. They were treated very well by all the citizens and present day soldiers. Sheridan met "Gino" who recalled that Sheridan gave him a chocolate bar when he was a child (70 years ago). He returned the favour and gave a chocolate bar to Sheridan 70 years later with thanks.

Every town has a band and welcomed the Canadians wherever they visited. The last week was the one where they had the most ceremonies. Sheridan and one other Canadian soldier (from Picton) were the only ones at the final ceremony.

Sheridan was fortunate to lay a wreath and spend a few moments at the grave of one of his friends and fellow Regiment soldiers.

This was a wonderful experience for both Sheridan, Susan and two of their daughters. We are so very lucky to live in Canada where we are a peaceful country without war in our borders.

Thanks to all who serve to keep us safe and free.
