She was previously Director of Sales and Revenue for the Capitol Theatre, 2008 co-chair of the United Way, current President of Theatre Kent, author of two musicals produced in New York (The Littlest Rockette) coming to the Kiwanis Theatre in November. She has a Bachelor of Fine Arts from New York University. She has worked in marketing for M&M/Mars and Knorr. She has also been a theatrical agent for Stephen Sondheim and Maya Angelou. She is a Mom to two wonderful little girls-Blake and Frankie.



Ronald McDonald House tries to give families as much normal as possible as they go through the most stressful time of their lives. The House doubled in size in 2011 to meet increased need. There are 34 family bedrooms each with their own bathroom, a large kitchen and dining room. It also has multiple lounge spaces. A craft and games room, media room for family movie nights a teen game room, a fitness center, courtyard with patio, outdoor kitchen and BBQ are also available for the familie.

Families pay \$10 a night to stay, if the house is full then the families go to a local Hotel, and still only pay \$10 with the rest of the cost being paid for by Ronald McDonald House.

365 days a year there are Volunteers who prepare dinner for the families in residence.

The seriousness of the child's illness determines the eligibility to stay at the house. Children recover better and quicker when their families are with them.
